We are pleased to welcome you to the International Arbitration Summer Session and the Summer Session on Environmental Law at American University, Washington College of Law (WCL).

Below you will find information regarding daily travel to and from WCL, class materials, use of technological facilities during the Summer Session and other materials we hope you will find useful.

TRANSPORTATION

The Washington College of Law is located at 4801 Massachusetts Avenue in the upper northwest section of Washington, D.C. **Please note that this is about five city blocks west from the main American University campus. A map is attached for your convenience.**

METRO



From Union Station, National Airport, or downtown Washington, Washington's Metro subway trains run Monday through Thursday, 5:00 a.m. to midnight; Friday, 5:00 a.m. to 3:00 a.m., Saturday, 7:00 a.m. to 3:00 a.m., and Sunday, 7:00 a.m. to midnight. The closest Metro stop to American University (AU) is **Tenleytown/AU** (also called Tenley Circle) on the Red Line. Public Metro buses run on regular schedules from Tenley Circle to WCL. From the exit marked Tenleytown/AU, continue on foot past the Sears Home Appliance Showroom on your left. Past the Sears store you will come to a Metro bus stop, next to the AU bus stop. Take the N8 bus marked Wesley Heights which will take you directly to the WCL, at 4810 Massachusetts Avenue. Travel time is approximately 10 minutes. Buses depart from the stop every 20 minutes in the morning until 10:00 a.m. Thereafter, the bus departs every 30 minutes. For return trips, you may access the bus from the opposite side of the street on Massachusetts.

Regular Metrorail fare is between \$1.65 and \$4.50. Farecard machines are in every station. Small bills are recommended. There are no change machines in stations and farecard machines provide only up to \$5 in change (in coins).

Metrobus fares are \$1.35 for regular buses and \$3.10 for express buses. Bus drivers do not carry money. Please have your pass, transfer or exact fare ready when you board.

WCL SHUTTLE SERVICE



From the Tenleytown/AU Metro stop you can pick up the Law School Shuttle (WCL Direct Shuttle), which is located across the street from the station, at the corner of Albemarle Street and Fort Drive. The shuttle service is free and runs from 8:00 a.m. to 12:30

a.m. on weekdays. If coming from the Metro station, take the east side exit, marked “Tenleytown/AU.” From there, continue straight ahead. A Sears Home Appliance Showroom will be on your left. You will see an American University main campus Shuttle stop. The WCL Shuttle stop is across the street from there. The Shuttle will take you directly to the Law School. For return trips, the Shuttle departs from the School at the same location where it drops you off from the Metro. You can find the shuttle schedule for the summer at the link below:

WALKING

The Law School building at 4801 Massachusetts Avenue is about a one mile (1.6 kilometers) walk, through a residential area, from the Tenleytown/AU Metrorail Station. If walking: exit the Station and proceed to Albemarle Street. Turn right on to Albemarle Street. Follow Albemarle Street to 48th Street, NW. Turn left on 48th and proceed about four blocks to Massachusetts Avenue, NW. The Law School is situated on your right. Enter it from the Massachusetts Avenue side. (See map on red).

DRIVING

Parking is available at 4801 Massachusetts Avenue. You may park your vehicles in the WCL garage without a permit. A list of participants has been provided to the garage staff at WCL.

PENCE LAW LIBRARY

The Pence Law Library entrance is on the first floor Law School building. The Law Library is open to the general public. Library hours for the summer term can be found on the Pence Law Library website <http://library.wcl.american.edu/hours.cfm>.

To start a search for books and periodicals, go to <http://library.wcl.american.edu/> and click on "Library Catalog". The catalog identifies all of the materials housed in the library, as well as electronic resources available for use within the library.

Many periodicals, including law reviews, bar journals, and newsletters, are available through Hein Online, a full-text electronic database available on the Pence Law Library website, under "Research Tools Links." Many indexes to legal periodicals are also available at this link. Full-text non-legal periodicals and indexes are also available at "[Articles & Indexes](#)." To access the electronic version of these periodicals through Pence Law Library webpage, you must be connected to the WCL network, either in the law school or via remote access using your my.american.edu password.

Professional reference assistance is available in the main reading room on the first floor of the Library. Reference service is available from 10:00 a.m. to 9:00 p.m., Monday through Thursday; 10:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m., Friday; 12:00 p.m. to 5:00 pm Saturday from 12:00 p.m. to 5:00 p.m., and Sunday from 12:00 p.m. to 6:00 p.m. during the academic year. Reference librarians are also available to faculty and students for research consultations by appointment. You may contact a reference librarian at reflib@wcl.american.edu or by telephone at 202-274-4352.

To make copies of publications in the Library, self-service photocopiers are located on both floors of the Library, and photocopy machines for microform are located in the Reserve Room on the first floor. All Library photocopiers require the use of a copy card. You can purchase a copy card at one of the "Card Value Centers" for \$1 in one of the Library's copy rooms. Please note that there are no facilities available for making change from coins or bills. There are several banks and local businesses in the immediate area of the Law School that might assist you, as well as an automatic change machine in the vending area near the Student Lounge on the 6th floor

COMPUTER USE AND TECHNOLOGICAL FACILITIES

The Computer Lab is located on the second floor of the library straight ahead from the top of the stairs, in the open area along the back wall. The computer lab allows you to edit papers, check e-mail and do research. The library has research ONLY stations located on the first and second floor. You may do research using Lexis, Westlaw, CALI and the internet. However, editing papers and checking email is not permitted at these stations.

The Washington College of Law has designed its computer system to enable students to take maximum advantage of computers and the Internet. As one of the most "wired" law schools in the United States, WCL maintains a computer lab as well as laptop accessibility throughout its building. Our goal is to allow students to access the resources, data, and cutting edge technology that will enable them to distinguish themselves in both the academic and professional arenas. Proficiency with computer technology and an understanding of the Internet is a necessity in most professional fields and will only become more significant in the future.

The computer resources at WCL have been optimized to fit the needs of law students. The network connection is available in the classrooms and the library, and student computers are available in the computer lab. The lab maintains 52 PC workstations and 21 Macintosh PowerPC terminals. Students can also utilize the two HP 8000 laser printers in the lab or access the laser printers in the library via their own laptops. These resources allow for access to the Internet, to personalized e-mail accounts, and to the network printing system.

If you wish to use your own laptop, a network connection is available throughout WCL. Please make sure you bring a network cable with you or you have a wireless card installed. You will need to visit the Computer Help Desk on the second floor of the Library to register your laptop in order to access WCL's network.

How to Login/Logout

As you sit down at a PC there will be a login window with two fields on information for you to fill in. Circulation desk staff will give you the necessary information to log onto the library computers.

Once you have finished work at your computer station, please make sure to logout. To do so go to the "Start Menu" and select "Close all programs and log on as a different user". This will detach your account from the network, allowing you to log on in the future.

Safeway, off of Wisconsin Avenue (between Tenleytown and Friendship Heights)

Directions: Walk or take AU shuttle bus to Tenleytown metro station. Walk past metro station and down Wisconsin avenue about two blocks past the CVS. The Safeway is located behind the Volvo car dealership.

Giant, 3336 Wisconsin Avenue (between Cathedral and Tenleytown Metro)

Directions: Walk or take AU shuttle bus to Tenley campus. Walk in opposite direction of the metro station, past the McDonald's and movie theater. Walk is approximately 15-20 minutes, and the Giant is on the right side of Wisconsin Avenue (towards Georgetown).

Note: There are other Giant Food stores at the Van Ness Metro station, and the Friendship Heights metro station.

Directions: Take the AU shuttle to Wisconsin Avenue/Tenley Campus. Then take any even numbered 30 (30, 32, 34, 36, 38) bus to Wisconsin and M Street.

Mazza Gallery, Wisconsin Ave, 202-966-6114

Directions: Take the Metro to the Friendship Heights station. One of the exits takes you right into the mall. Another takes you to other stores across the street.

Directions: Take the Metro to the Grosvenor station, then take Ride-On bus, number 47, toward the mall (address above)

WCL WALKING TOUR

The John Sherman Myers & Alvina Reckman Myers Law Center is our state-of-the-art facility located in the nation’s capital. WCL first occupied this six-story, 185,000 square foot building in January 1996. This date coincided with our 100-year anniversary. The Law Center’s designers studied 30 other law schools in order to create the most effective legal learning environment. This facility incorporates classrooms and courtrooms equipped with modern technology but also fosters more informal exchanges between students and faculty with its open meeting spaces and lounge areas on each level.

The visitor guide describes the points of interest throughout the building. Enjoy this self-guided tour, and please feel free to ask students, faculty or staff questions about the building or their experiences. You will find that there are few other prestigious law schools so comfortable and friendly.

FIRST FLOOR

Los Pobres del Mundo and Shiffman Classrooms, Room 100 and Room 101

Both of these classrooms are used primarily for first- and second- year required classes.

Legal Writing Center, Suite 129

This suite houses the offices for the Legal Method program. As you enter this suite you will notice the glassed-in reception area. This part of the suite houses offices for our three full-time legal writing instructors. Instead of entering the reception area, continue down the main hallway. This space includes a multi-purpose conference room and meeting offices for our adjunct-writing instructors. From the main hallway in this suite you can access the National Equal Justice Library.

National Equal Justice Library

WCL was selected to become the national archive for the nation's 120 year-old legal services movement due to our reputation for legal services work through our renowned clinical law program. The archive includes publications, records, books, case notes and artifacts to chronicle the history and development of the legal services movement. Please exit this suite, walk through the lobby towards the elevators and enter the Law Library.

The Law Library

As you walk in, turn left to enter the Reserve Room. This room is patterned after the Library of Congress, so that individuals may research freely among numerous reference books, law treaties, government publications, and microfiche. The library offers an in-house collection of almost half a million volumes, plus access to a vast amount of information in digital format. Most of the library seating is equipped with data port access for laptop computer use through which students have unlimited access to WestLaw, Lexis/Nexis and the Internet. The library contains 17 iMac computer research stations located on the first and second floors. A student convenience center is located in Room 104 of the library. This center houses copiers, fax machines and various other supplies to assist student needs. During the 2000 fall semester a new large study room was added on the first floor of the library.

The Goodman Rare Book Room, Room 121

Located on the first floor of the library, this priceless collection includes over 250 volumes of early American and English legal texts, including the first American edition of William Blackstone's *Commentaries*, a 1531 edition of *Registrum Brevium* (believed to be the first English law book printed from movable type), and the first edition of Oliver Wendell Holmes' *The Common Law*, published in 1881.

SECOND FLOOR

The entire second floor encompasses the computer lab, library holdings, and study areas. Walk up the main library staircase to the second floor.

Computer Lab

The lab is located at the back of the second floor behind the first set of bookshelves. The lab contains 50 student workstations and is staffed by a full-time lab manager and part-time student workers. Keep walking - get a feel for the expansiveness and openness of the library. There is ample space for studying individually or in groups, including spacious study rooms. Exit the library and take the elevators to the third floor.

THIRD FLOOR

Meet the International Legal Studies Program Staff (ILSP) on this floor.

The Dean's Suite

Follow signs to Rooms 356-381. You will see a sign entitled Dean's Suite, enter the wooden double doors. This reception area is known as The Law School Living Room. The Dean hosts special functions in this area. This suite includes the Office of the Dean, Office of Academic Affairs, and the Office of Finance and Administration.

FOURTH FLOOR

The Experimental Courtroom, Room 415

Exit the Dean's Suite and turn left. Follow the hallway to the staircase on your right. As you walk left from the top of the staircase, you will find this courtroom on your left. This is one of three courtrooms in the building. It is equipped with the latest video and audio technology, allowing full evaluation of courtroom activity and performance. All of the room's furniture is mobile - allowing classes to simulate any court decor.

Clinic Offices and Work Areas, Suite 417

The Clinical Program functions similarly to a law firm. WCL's top ranked clinical program offers eight clinics ranging from international human rights law to tax law.

It is important that we do not disturb the clinics. You can view the student attorney's workspace from the windows along the hallway by Suite 417. Please note that half of the fourth floor is dedicated to the clinic area and contains the following:

Interview rooms, student workstations (equipped with computers and phones),
Clinic Library, Clinic Faculty Offices and Conference Room.

Edward Bou Classroom, Room 402

After viewing the clinic area, pass through the elevator and follow the signs to Room 402. **Please do not enter if there is a class in session.**

FIFTH FLOOR

Weinstein Moot Courtroom, Room 528

As you exit the staircase, walk straight and then bear left. Upon entry, note the wood paneled jury box and authentic decor of the room. There are video cameras and monitors, microphones and powerful audio speakers. There is a Judge's bench and witness box that provide a realistic simulation experience for students. Attached to the courtroom is a Judge's Chamber

Student Organizations, Rooms 532-542

Exit the Weinstein Moot Courtroom and make a sharp right at the wall of lockers. These offices house the student organizations.

LL.M. Program on Law & Government, Suite 515

SIXTH FLOOR

Mooers-Morella Ceremonial Courtroom, Room 603

Take the stairs and follow signs to Room 603. This is one of the largest rooms in the building, capable of seating 150-200 observers. It is used as a competition courtroom and

a conference center. When Supreme Court Justices Rehnquist and Ginsburg came to WCL, they spoke in this room. Their speeches were televised live in the room next door and throughout the building on our TV monitors located all over the building.

Dr. Louis P. Levitt Lecture Hall, Room 602

This large lecture hall seats 150 students. It is used for classes and conference events. Continue past this classroom, make a right and walk down the hallway.

As with most of the 6th floor, the premier space in the building is reserved for student use. Each journal office has large meeting/editing areas.

Student Lounges

This study and social area contains your student mailboxes and announcement boards. It is also where we host our lunches with the Director. This gives students a chance to talk to the director about student issues in a relaxed setting. Otherwise, here the students may relax or study, find out about social and organizational events, or prepare for class.

Dining Hall

This area is used for daily meals and special events. It is common to see faculty and students eating together. Bon Appetit prepares three meals a day. Students can purchase food with either a meal card or cash. This area is also open for studying and often students bring food from home or from local sandwich shops. The dining room is also where we host our International Food Fairs and the Fall Embassy Receptions.
