

Professor Ala'i was appointed to the tenured faculty of the Washington College of Law in 2003. She teaches and specializes in International Trade Law, and WTO/GATT Law in particular, Law and Development, and Comparative Law and Religion. She also teaches International Business Transactions, and a seminar entitled Transnational Reach of U.S. Economic Regulation. In spring 2005 Professor Ala'i was the acting director of the International Legal Studies Program and from 2003-2005 she was the co-chair of the International Economic Law Interest Group of the American Society of International Law (ASIL). In that capacity she organized and hosted a conference entitled "Trade as a Guarantor of Peace, Liberty and Security?"
