Adjunct Instructor Jarrett B. Perlow currently serves as the staff attorney for the U.S. District Court for the Eastern District of Virginia, Alexandria Division, where he provides legal advice and assistance to the Court on cases dealing with habeas corpus law, prisoner conditions and civil rights complaints, and general unrepresented civil complaints. Additionally, he supervises the Court's pro se law clerk office, which is a centralized resource for the entire court tasked with handling the high volume of unrepresented prisoner litigation filed in the Eastern District of Virginia. Before becoming staff attorney, Mr. Perlow was a pro se law clerk in the same office. He is admitted to practice in Virginia and the District of Columbia, as well as before the U.S. Court of Appeals for the Fourth Circuit and the U.S. District Court for the Eastern District of Virginia.

Mr. Perlow received his Juris Doctor, cum laude, from American University's Washington College of Law in 2004, where he was Editor in Chief of the Administrative Law Review and a Coordinating Dean's Fellow and Dean's Fellow in the Legal Rhetoric Writing & Research Program.
