Transfer Application Requirements**

Applications submitted by LLM alumni will be reviewed by the JD Admissions Committee and will be evaluated within the transfer application pool.

Application Deadline: June 15

LLM/JD Application Checklist

Transfer application – available on-line at <http://www.wcl.american.edu/admiss/transfer.cfm>.
Include a personal statement and resume.

Application fee of \$70.

LSAT. This test must be taken no later than June of the year for which admission is requested.
Note: Applicants are required to register for LSDAS. An official copy of your report will be requested automatically by the admissions office upon receipt of your transfer application.

LSAC foreign transcript evaluation. LSDAS provides a JD credential assembly service for foreign educated candidates. The admissions office requires all applicants who received their undergraduate degree from an institution located outside the United States or Canada to register for this service. A copy of the evaluation will be requested automatically by the admissions office upon receipt of your application. Information is posted on-line at www.lsac.org.

Letter of recommendation from a WCL faculty member knowledgeable about applicant's academic achievement.

JD counseling form signed by the LLM academic advisor.

Official transcript of LLM academic record. Complete request form available in the Office of the Registrar.

Copy of WCL LLM student file. Complete request form available in the Office of the Registrar.

Original copy of undergraduate transcript sent to WCL directly from the school that awarded the baccalaureate degree, or the equivalent.

TOEFL/IELTS – score report submitted to the LLM program may be used for JD admissions.
