This article provides an overview of issues likely to dominate the administrative law agenda in upcoming years. These issues include how agencies can do more with less; the congressional review process; regulatory reform; the information revolution; federalism; downsizing and retrenchment in the federal government; and administrative adjudication. Due to the wide array of administrative issues likely to arise, the author advocates for the formation of a governmental organization in which concentrated research, consensus building, and development of objective critiques of presidential and congressional initiatives could take place to enhance the future of administrative law.
