Abstract by Suzanne De Armond Mucchetti

This report of the Citizens for Independent Courts' Task Force on Federal Judicial Selection discusses the problems of the partisan ideology, delay of judicial selections, and courts' lack of independence. The Report notes that the U.S. is experiencing increased partisan disagreement about judicial selection, and considers what the role of ideology should be in the context of federal judicial selection. The Report makes recommendations for reducing delay in judicial selections. The Report concludes by calling for greater leadership and self-restraint by those executive and legislative branch officials that are involved in federal judicial selection.
