The Law and Government Scholars Program provides 10 credits in tuition support for one academic year. The award will be split equally between the fall and spring semesters only. Up to three Law and Government Scholars are chosen each fall.

Special note to international applicants: The Program on Law & Government can grant these scholarships only to students who are eligible to receive an I-20 from the University and who maintain legal immigration status as an F-1 visa holder. In order to receive an I-20, students must submit the Certification of Finances for International Students (CFIS) form with this application (if it has not been submitted already). You must be able to demonstrate that you can support the remainder of the cost of the LL.M. program.
