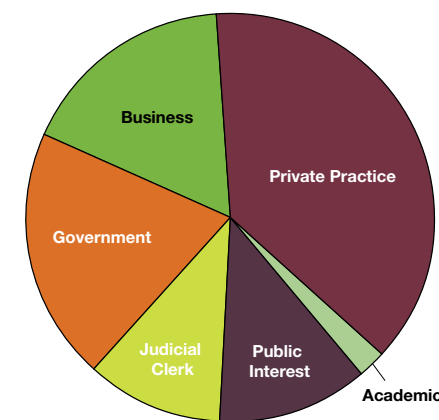
Full-time student, Class of 2012

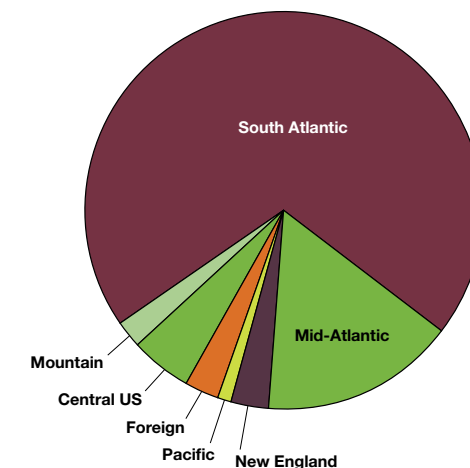
CAREER AND PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT

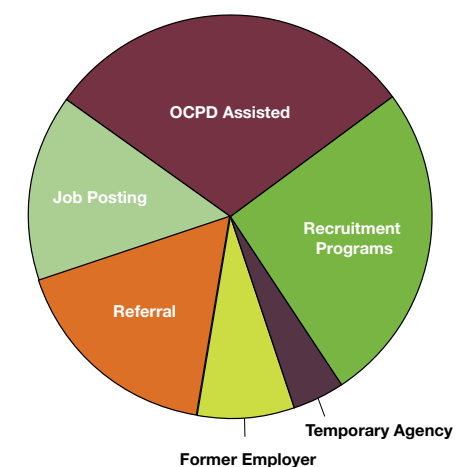
EMPLOYMENT SECTOR CLASS OF 2010
