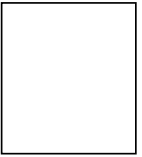

# SUMMER INSTITUTE ON LAW & GOVERNMENT 2011

The Summer Institute on Law and Government is a program designed for both experienced practitioners and law students who are serious about public service. One part of the program, *The Washington Lawyer's Toolbox*, will focus on the complex challenges of practicing law in Washington, D.C., including indispensable updates on lobbying, administrative and regulatory process, Supreme Court advocacy, election and campaign finance law, and ten years after 9/11 developments in national security law and immigration law.

The second part, entitled *Lawyering in the New Financial Landscape*, will comprehensively address the ways in which the financial meltdown and the resulting Dodd-Frank legislation are reshaping regulation of key financial institutions and practices at home.

Topics will be covered in three-hour blocks and taught by a variety of law professors, attorneys working for government agencies and in private practice. Attendees may craft a curriculum to fit their individual interests and schedules as classes will be offered throughout the day and evening to provide maximum flexibility. This format will permit flexible attendance throughout the two-week period. Students must complete four of these blocks and a take-home exam in order to earn one academic credit. Practitioners may earn Continuing Legal Education credits, and those who complete four or more blocks will also receive a certificate of participation.
