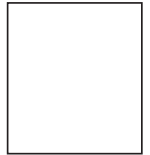

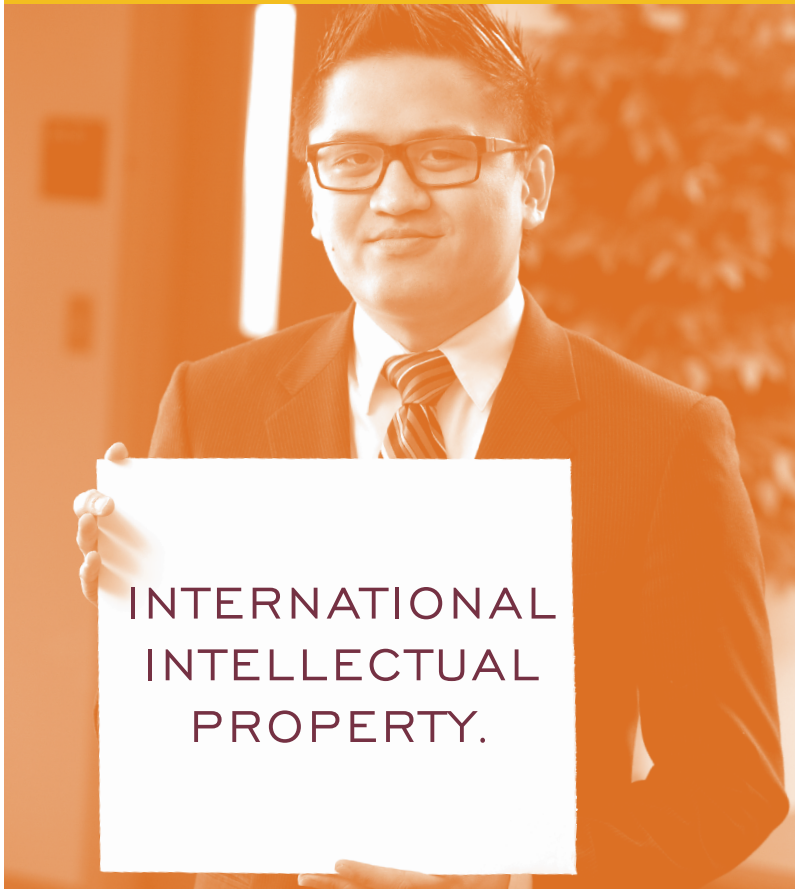

INTERNATIONAL INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY SUMMER PROGRAM 2011

The 2011 International Intellectual Property Summer Session offers a concentrated program of courses designed for students, practitioners, government officials, and scholars interested in the advanced study of international intellectual property law.

The location of American University Washington College of Law in the nation's capital provides students with an opportunity to combine participation in the summer session with seasonal employment or internships.

For the first time this year, the program will include a partnership with the law school's Summer Program in International Organizations, Law and Diplomacy, permitting students to complete part of their study in Geneva, Switzerland.

Courses taught in Washington may be taken for academic or Continuing Legal Education credit. Students may receive academic credit at other institutions that have or complete a credit transfer agreement with AUWCL (consult your institution for more information).

The courses are organized so that no two conflict in scheduling, thus offering students a choice from nine academic credit hours of instruction.

COURSES IN WASHINGTON, D.C.:

Introduction to International Intellectual Property

May 31, June 1 (T, W): 9am-12pm, 2pm-5pm

1 Academic Credit; 12 CLE Credits

The course is highly recommended as a prerequisite for other courses in the summer program for those who have not previously taken a course in international intellectual property law.

Advanced Issues in International Intellectual Property Law

June 2 -3 (Th, F); June 6, June 9 (M, Th): 9am-12pm, 2pm-5pm

2 Academic Credits; 24 CLE Credits

Topics will include: intellectual property and access to medicines, recent decisions on intellectual property by WTO dispute resolution panels, the rise of the "enforcement agenda" in international intellectual property, and the evolving domestic and international law regulating digital file sharing.

International Technology Licensing Agreements

May 31-June 2 (T, W, Th); June 6-9 (M, T, W, Th); June 13-15 (M, T, W, Th):

5:50pm-8:45pm *3 Academic Credits; 36 CLE Credits*

This course examines international and comparative law governing transactions granting the right to use intellectual property rights in cross-border business dealings.

Intellectual Property & Sustainable Development

June 7 -8 (T, W): 9am-12pm, 2pm-5pm

1 Academic Credit; 12 CLE Credits

This course explores how intellectual property governs the intersections among environmental sustainability, technological innovation and knowledge policy.
