On behalf of American University Washington College of Law (WCL), it is my pleasure to welcome you to the 14th Annual Equal Justice Foundation (EJF) Auction. Our community has a longstanding commitment to public interest law, and the EJF is an important example of this tradition. The EJF is a student-run, nonprofit organization that raises awareness in law schools about the purpose and importance of public interest law in society, and provides scholarships to WCL students who have obtained unpaid summer positions in that field in this country and abroad. The EJF scholarships enable WCL students to gain valuable experience in the public interest sector, while providing a wide range of critical services to underrepresented members of society. The Equal Justice Foundation (EJF) provides scholarships to Washington College of Law students who have obtained unpaid summer positions with public interest organizations in the United States and abroad. EJF enables WCL students to gain valuable experience in the public interest sector, while providing critical services to underrepresented members of our communities.

Established at American University, Washington College of Law in 1989, EJF is a non-profit, student-run organization. Throughout the school year, EJF raises money and collects donations from students, faculty, staff and the business community to fund grants for WCL students who have secured positions with public interest organizations and demonstrated commitment to the Equal Justice Foundation. All proceeds are directly distributed to WCL students; no money is used for overhead.

Now in its seventeenth year at WCL, EJF has awarded more than 320 fellowships through the increased support of the greater WCL community, and largely funded by our annual Public Interest Auction.

With the generous support of the community, the Equal Justice Foundation hopes to continue to raise enough funds to ensure that no WCL student will be financially constrained from working in the public interest legal sector.





## **Payment Options and Procedures**

### **Payment Options:**

We accept cash, personal checks, and credit cards. Payment must be received by the close of the event. For group purchases, we will accept a combination of cash, personal checks, and/or credit cards as payment. All items will be received upon full payment. If you anticipate bidding on, and winning, more than one item, whether in the Silent or Live Auction, you may establish a “tab” and cash out at the end of the evening. However, you must still report to the Cashier's Table upon winning any item. If you create a “tab,” once you are finished for the evening, please return to the Cashier's Table to cash out and receive your items.

### **Silent Auction Procedures:**

Some Silent Auction items will be on display during the event. At the appropriate bidding tables, there will be full descriptions and bidding tickets for each item. Please fill out the appropriate information on a bid ticket, and place it in the box corresponding to the item on which you seek to bid. You will be unable to see previous bid amounts for any particular item. The highest bidder will win the item. In the event that there are two (2) or more cards showing the highest bid amount, the winning ticket will be drawn randomly from those showing the same high bid amount. We encourage bidders to bid with dollars and cents to decrease the likelihood of two or more cards showing the highest bid amount. All winning bids will be posted at approximately 9:30 PM. If you are a winning bidder, please make your way to the Cashier's Table to pay for and receive your item.



**“33 Red Balloons”:**

At approximately 7:45 PM, 33 red balloons will be available for purchase at the Cashier’s Table. Each balloon contains one gift certificate; either for a product or service ranging from \$25-\$45, a 2-month complimentary membership to Bally Total Fitness, or for a discounted BAR/BRI course. You have a 1 in 33 chance of receiving a balloon with the \$1500 BAR/BRI certificate. In exchange for your \$30, you will receive a red card printed with the words “33 Red Balloons.” At approximately 8:45 PM, all card holders will be asked to hold up their card. At that time, someone holding 33 balloons will come around to exchange your red card for a red balloon. At approximately 9:00 PM, all balloon holders will be asked to pop their balloons to reveal what is hidden inside!

**Live Auction Procedures:**

Everyone who plans to bid on a Live Auction item must have a bid card printed with a unique bid card number. Bid cards are available for check-out at the Auction Entrance Table. Please return your bid card at the end of the evening.

The auctioneer will introduce each item with a brief description and a starting bid. To accept the bid amount, please raise your numbered bid card and wait to be acknowledged by the auctioneer. Each bid will be raised by the auctioneer. Once there are no increases being offered by the bidders, the auctioneer will close the bidding for the item and indicate the person who placed the winning bid by referencing the winner’s bid card number. If you are a winning bidder, you will be approached by a volunteer to receive the information required to make payment and receive your item.

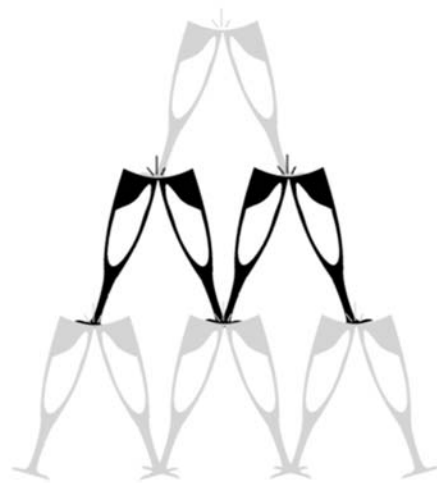


