### **Tipping in Europe:**

Tipping in European restaurants can be confusing. **Service charge is almost always already included.** Thus, tipping American-style means tipping on the tip!

Event though tipping is already included, **leaving a small tip**--from a few coins to several Euros, depending on the quality of the restaurant--**is still customary when the service is good.**

And when you're a new regular trying to build relationships with the staff at your corner café, forgetting to leave something can be a big mistake, while leaving too much arouses suspicion.

Marriott properties in Brussels. One can also take any train to Brussels Central and walk downhill to the hotel (10-15 minutes).

**17:30** Prof. VIANO will lead a brief orientation tour of central Brussels (Optional).

**Security While Traveling in Europe:** We must be very careful and alert when traveling at all times but particularly when we move from city to city. Using a safety pouch or belt to carry valuables on your person is strongly recommended. Luggage is at times stolen from trains. Try to keep luggage with or close to you when on the train. Keep an eye on it at all train stops. If you bring a laptop, it is a good idea to consider buying a safety cable to secure it when you leave the hotel or when you place it on an overhead rack on a train. As a group traveling together with luggage, etc. we attract attention. Do not leave luggage unattended in public places, including the hotel lobby upon check-in. Develop a buddy system to watch out for each other's safety & belongings.

The newly renovated Brussels Marriott Hotel is ideally situated in Brussels city center. Located opposite the Brussels Stock Exchange and within a short walking distance to the historic attractions, like the Grand Place, and the business district.

Brussels is a captivating city, steeped in a rich, diverse culture that has been evolving for more than 1,000 years. With its French & Flemish influences, famed institutions, museums and architectural marvels, it offers vast international appeal. Within walking distance of its most revered landmarks, including the Grand Place & the Mont des Arts, you'll find the Brussels Marriott Hotel. Set where an island once stood in a flowing river, this grand city center hotel now offers luxurious accommodations in a historic building and neighborhood. Here, vibrantly appointed guest rooms feature the plush new Marriott bed with down comforters, down duvets and luxury pillows to cradle you each night. From the large work desk, high-speed Internet keeps you connected.

*Prof. Viano's recommendations:* Near the hotel, there is an ample selection of venues for **dining** and entertainment. **St. Catherine Square and the old Fish Market Square** offer excellent **seafood restaurants**. Exit the hotel, go right, go to the end of the block, continue to the end of the next block, go right until you see the square in front of St. Catherine's church. To go to the Fish Market Square, pass the church and walk along its length, keeping the church to your right. The square will appear to your left.

In our neighborhood, I can recommend: **along Rue de Flandre/Vlaamsesteenweg** (go out of the hotel, turn right, walk along Dansaertstraat, go about 3 blocks, turn right at Nieuwe Graanmarkt, follow it 2 blocks or so to Rue de Flandre; if you miss the turn at Nieuwe Graanmarkt, turn right at the next street, Papenvest):

*Le Pre Sale*, Rue de Flandre #20, a reliable neighborhood choice

*La Maree*, Rue de Flandre #99, non touristy, classical local scene, mussels and seafood

*Le Royal*, rue de Flandre #103, is a youthful, trendy brasserie, traditional good Belgian staples, outside seating.

If you want meat, in our vicinity, I can recommend *La Villette*, romantic, typical meat-based Belgian fare, Oude Graanmarkt/ rue du Vieux Marche aux Grains 3, near a small square, outdoor seating available. For directions see below, Cremerie Lindbeek (they are next door).

Very near the hotel there are also several **supermarkets, including Super GB** (Halles and Marche aux Poulets) **and Delhaize** (Anspach and Marche aux Poulets; exit the hotel, go left/left along Blvd. Anspach, 2 blocks; from Delhaize, Super GB is at the end of the block of Marche au Poulets, on the right handside, downstairs). Across from Super GB there is a Chinese supermarket.

Very **reasonable eateries for lunch** on a sunny day, are **Mer du Nord**, Rue St. Catherine 45 and the **Poissonnerie** across the street from Mer du Nord. Exit the hotel, go right; at the end of the block go right again; the restaurants are the next corner. One eats standing at the counter, basically on the street. Some locals rate Mer du Nord one of the best seafood restaurant in Brussels.

Also near the hotel is the **best cheese store** in Brussels where one can buy baguette sandwiches: **Cremerie Lindbeek**, 4 rue du Vieux Marche aux Grains (English spoken). Go out of the hotel, go right, at the end of the block, turn left, cross the street, take Kartuizerstraat that takes you to Oude Graanmarkt (Vieux Marche etc). Another good **sandwich shop** near the hotel is **Le Pain Quotidien**, Dansaert street 16A. Go out of the hotel, turn right, walk to the address.

The neighborhood just behind the buildings in front of the hotel has a lot of fun establishments, especially at night.. Go out of the hotel, cross the street, walk left, at the corner turn right and explore.

**Laundromat:** The easiest thing to do might be to take the metro (underground tram) a couple of stops to Anneessens, where you will find **Magic Wash at 10, Place Fontainas**. This is between the Bourse and Anneessens stops but closer to the latter, so you would need to walk back towards Bourse. From our hotel, it is about 5-6 blocks walk along Blvd. Anspach, past Lombardstraat.

There is also **Washing 65 at 65 rue du Midi**, 4 blocks walk from our hotel. Go out of hotel, cross the street; go left; at the corner, go right onto Blvd. Anspach and walk along it leaving the Bourse behind you; at the nearest light, cross to the other side of Blvd. Anspach and keep going. When you get to Lombardstraat, go left; Rue de Midi will be on your right after 2 blocks.

**Chocolate** in Brussels: the city is one of the chocolate capitals of the world. There are several good brands available. One of the more popular is **Leonidas**, founded by an American, obviously of Greek origins, who fell in love with a Belgian young woman and...s tayed in Brussels opening a very successful business. They are not the best chocolates but they are very good and reasonably priced. There are Leonidas outlets everywhere, one on Blvd. Anspach near our hotel. In my experience, the top of the line is **Marcolini**, Place du Grand Sablon/Rue des Minimes/Minimenstraat 1, 1000. Look on your map for Grand Sablon Square or check [www.marcolini.be](http://www.marcolini.be) It is a 15 minutes walk uphill from the hotel. Expensive but worth it!

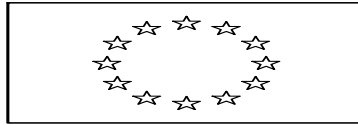

The **location of the hotel** in PARIS: it is very central, right on the river, across from l'Ile de la Cité' with the cathedral of Notre Dame etc.

**See Paris by bike:** try out Paris' new [bike stations](#) that can be found every 300 meters (328 yards). [Velib](#) has set up a rental system similar to those found in other European and now also U.S. cities. It's a great way to get around for cheap. Each rider needs a credit card and signing up with the automated machine is easy and self-explanatory (in most languages).

### **Tipping in Europe:**

Tipping in European restaurants can be confusing. Service charge is almost always already included. Thus, tipping American-style means tipping on the tip!

Event though tipping is already included, **leaving a small tip**--from a few coins to several Euros, depending on the quality of the restaurant--**is still customary** when the service is good.

And when you're a new regular trying to build relationships with the staff at your corner café, forgetting to leave something can be a big mistake, while leaving too much arouses suspicion.

Here are some safe guidelines on what to tip (*on the bill as a whole, not per person*) in the **Eurozone**:

- For a coffee or drink, 10 or 20 cents, if anything
- For a light breakfast or lunch, a euro
- For a full lunch or a light dinner, two Euros
- For an elegant meal in a nice restaurant, five Euros
- In a grand restaurant, ten Euros or more depending on the attentiveness of the service
- In a large group setting, it's polite to add a couple of Euros to the indications above

**When in doubt after a complete meal, a 2 euro coin** is your best bet--small enough to be modest, large enough to signal appreciation...and so, a good thing to have at the ready in your back pocket.

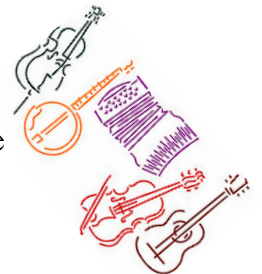

### **Bus service to Geneva:**

The bus service between Ferney and Geneva is provided by the “**F**” bus line. It will take us to all the major institutions visited and to the main train station, Cornavin.

Please Note: It does not run that frequently, especially outside of “rush” hour. It is important that we board the bus at the times indicated below so that we may be on time for our appointments.

Off rush hour, there are few runs each hour, normally on the hour and then on the 20 and 40 minute (e.g. 12 noon, 12:20, 12:40, 13:00)

- The last buses back to Ferney, leave from Cornavin at 23:05 and at 0:10.
- The terminal at Cornavin is behind the station, not in front.

Leave from the hotel for the bus stop at least 10 minutes before the bus is scheduled to depart from Brunette, our local stop in Ferney.

Bus tickets can be purchased on the bus OR from machines at the bus stops with Euros or Swiss Francs. Inspectors do board buses to check on tickets. The fine can be CHF 50. We can also buy a 7-day pass at the bus system Office inside the Cornavin train station. Bring an ID and a passport size picture with you. There is a discount if you are 24 or younger. The 7-day pass is financially worthwhile only for those 24 years and under. One can also purchase **prepaid cards for CHF 10,20,30.**

If you can manage to see a doctor or even have an X-ray on your own, we strongly recommend that you go to France, Ferney Voltaire. It will cost you around 50 Euros for leg X-ray and 22 Euros for a visit to the doctor.

The cost in Switzerland is around 300 CHF for both X-ray and doctor visit at the Hospital de la Tour

Be very careful that you may have to pay the total amount of your bill before leaving the hospital in Switzerland, and the amount can be huge. The only insurance known by Swiss hospitals in Geneva are CIGNA and BLUE CROSS; for all the rest the patient will have to pay himself and be paid back after by his/her insurance. Make sure to have health insurance information with you at all times! Preferably use French hospitals and doctors.
