## Professor Rebecca Cook

CHAIR, INTERNATIONAL HUMAN RIGHTS LAW AND  
CO-DIRECTOR, INTERNATIONAL PROGRAMME ON REPRODUCTIVE HEALTH LAW,  
UNIVERSITY OF TORONTO FACULTY OF LAW

Health disparities are growing among women within and among countries. Professor Cook will explore the challenge of the fair allocation of scarce public health care resources by focusing on services for women and girls. She will discuss different ways of thinking about fairness in health care reform, the role of courts in promoting fairness, the use of affirmative action measures to address health disparities among women and girls, and the constitutional and human rights legal obligations of states to remedy these pressing inequalities.

### REBECCA COOK BIOGRAPHY

Rebecca J. Cook, A.B. (Barnard), M.A. (Tufts), M.P.A. (Harvard), J.D. (Georgetown), LL.M. (Columbia), J.S.D. (Columbia), called to the Bar of Washington, D.C., is Professor and Faculty Chair in International Human Rights, and Co-Director of the International Programme on Reproductive and Sexual Health Law in the Faculty of Law at the University of Toronto. She also holds positions in the Faculty of Medicine and the Joint Centre for Bioethics at the University of Toronto. She is ethical and legal issues co-editor of the International Journal of Gynecology and Obstetrics, and serves on the editorial advisory boards of Human Rights Quarterly and Reproductive Health Matters. Her publications include over one hundred and fifty books, articles and reports in the areas of international human rights, the law relating to women's health, and feminist ethics. She is the recipient of the Certificate of Recognition for Outstanding Contribution to Women's Health by the International Federation of Gynecologists and Obstetricians, the Ludwik and Estelle Jus Memorial Human Rights Prize, and is a Fellow of the Royal Society of Canada.
