## What is Desire to Learn (D2L)?

D2L is an online education platform that allows access to academic content online. D2L was created in 1999 as a platform that enables the creation of easy-access online courses and course building for instructors and students. You will use this platform to access reading assignments and group discussions.

#### How to Access the Online Education Platform

Please go to the Washington College of Law website at <u>www.wcl.american.edu</u>, under the "Academics" tab, scroll to "Online Education," and then click on "Online Course Login."





Once you have clicked on the "Online Education" link, you will be directed to a login page.

Forum Rules:	
1. Each question will be open as an independent discussion thread.	
2. Each response should be between 100 to 150 words.	
3. You must respond to each question ONCE as part of the discussion thread.	
4. If the original question has already been answered by a previous student, you must then respond to the student's comment and not the original question. This will allow for a buildup on comments which promotes discussion among students.	
5. All comments must be pertinent to the discussion topic and to the question in that specific thread. Any response that is limited to "I agree" or "I have the same opinion as" will not be considered a valid response.
