The Court of Justice of the European Union (CJEU) and the European Court of Human Rights (ECtHR) have played increasingly important roles in the EU since their creation in the 1950s. Decision-making in these courts do not occur in a vacuum; rather, it is informed by a wide variety of actors and circumstances in Luxembourg and in Strasbourg, in the Member States and even in the overseas territories where EU citizens have tangible rights.
