- **Background:** The Attorney General represents the United States in legal matters and gives advice and opinions to the President and to the heads of the executive departments of the Government upon request. Since 1870, the Attorney General has guided the world's largest law office and the central agency for enforcement of federal laws.
- Hiring Practices: Like nearly all of the federal agencies, the Office of the Attorney
 General posts job announcements directly to <u>USAjobs.gov</u>, which allows applicants to
 search openings by location or keyword, or with a specific Department of Justice agency.
 Openings for the entry-level honors program as well as vacancies for experienced
 attorneys are also posted at http://www.justice.gov/careers/careers.html.
- When they Hire: The deadline for the honors program is September 2. General openings are available year round as advertised on USAjobs.gov. Applicants should expect more than one round of interviewing for any given position.

- **Background:** The United States Attorney's Office for the District of Columbia is unique among U.S. Attorney's Offices in the size and scope of its work. It serves as both the local and the federal prosecutor for the nation's capital. On the local side, its prosecutions extend from misdemeanor drug possession cases to murders. On the federal side, its prosecutions extend from child pornography to gangs to financial fraud to terrorism. In both roles, the Office is committed to being responsive and accountable to the citizens of the District of Columbia.

Federal Public Defender for the District of Columbia

- **Background**: The Office of the Federal Public Defender for the District of Columbia represents indigent defendants primarily before the U.S. District Court for the District of Columbia and the U.S. Court of Appeals for the D.C. Circuit. Representation includes counsel and investigative, expert, and other services necessary for an adequate defense. They handle caseloads composed of federal misdemeanors, felonies, parole and probation violations, grand jury representations, direct appeals to the U.S. Court of Appeals for the District of Columbia, and petitions for writs of certiorari to the U.S. Supreme Court.
- **Hiring Practices:** They do not hire entry-level attorneys. Applicants must have at least three years of experience, preferably in criminal litigation. Judicial clerkship experience is also helpful.
- When to apply: Candidates should look for job openings on the Office's website located at http://dc.fd.org/vacancy.html.

The Office accepts internship applications year round, but students should consider the following application deadlines:

Spring Internship – Applications due December 1.

Summer Internship – Applications due February 1. Fall Internship – Applications due August 1.

Local Public Defender's Offices

Public Defender Service (PDS) of the District of Columbia

• **Background:** The Public Defender Service for the District of Columbia (PDS) provides and promotes quality legal representation to indigent adults and children facing a loss of liberty in the District of Columbia and thereby protects society's interest in the fair administration of justice. PDS is regarded as one of the best public defender offices—local or federal—in the country.

Hiring Practices: PDS posts a number of job openings, including internships and legal clerkships, at www.pdsdc.org/Employment/JobOpportunities.aspx. For full-time defender positions, PDS is typically looking for applicants with at least a year of post J.D. experience and litigation experience. Applications are available on its website and should be mailed to Jennifer K. Thomas, Legal Recruiting Office. Questions should be directed to Jennifer Thomas at (202) 824-2337 or jenthomas@pdsdc.org.

For its summer or semester law clerks, PDS selects 20-30 applicants per semester. PDS prefers 2L or 3L students, although 1L students with relevant experience are encouraged to apply. This position is unpaid. In the Summer, PDS offers its clerks a week long substantive training class, as well as a trial advocacy skills building series taught by experienced trial attorneys.

• When they hire: PDS hires pre-bar. It makes offers early during the second semester of the applicant's last year of law school, so interested candidates should apply in the early fall. They usually hire 6 to 10 attorneys per year. PDS requires 3L students to sit for the first available D.C. bar exam.

The Office of the State's Attorney is staffed with 70 full-time Assistant State's Attorneys, the elected State's Attorney, and two appointed Deputy State's Attorneys. Maryland Office of the Public Defender

- **Background:** With over 900 employees (570 attorneys), the Maryland Office of the Public Defender (OPD) is the largest legal services organization in the state. Through its twelve district offices and seven specialized divisions, the Office provides legal services to indigent defendants. Each District conforms to the statutory geographic boundaries of the Maryland District Courts. Representation is provided in District Courts, Juvenile Courts, Circuit Courts, judicial bail reviews and related collateral hearings, Children in Need of Assistance (CINA) and termination of parental rights (TPR) cases.

 OPD
 recruits entry-level attorneys to serve as Assistant Public Defenders in District Court two times a year. These attorneys serve as Assistant Public Defenders (APD I) at various locations throughout the State of Maryland and typically begin with OPD in the Spring (March) and the Fall (September).

Applications for Spring should be submitted before the end of January, and applications for the Fall round of interviewing should be submitted by August 1. - Background: The Office of the Federal Public Defender for the Eastern District of Virginia was established in 2001 and is dedicated to the defense of indigent clients charged with federal offenses. Its caseload ranges from petty offenses to the defense of complex felony prosecutions. The Eastern District of Virginia is one of two districts in the state and includes 43 of the state's 95 counties. The Eastern District of Virginia includes the Northern Virginia area, the greater Richmond area, and the Tidewater region of Virginia. Court locations are found in Alexandria, Newport News, Norfolk, and Richmond.

- Background: The Legal Aid Society's Criminal Practice, under the leadership of Seymour W. James, Jr., is the largest public defender program in the country and serves as the primary provider of indigent defense services in New York City. The Criminal Practice handles a total of more than 230,000 cases each year with a staff of 800, including approximately 550 staff attorneys, supervising attorneys and management attorneys and nearly 270 social workers, investigators, paralegals, and support and administrative staff.

The Bronx Defenders

The Bronx Defenders works through interdisciplinary teams comprised of criminal defense attorneys, family defense attorneys, civil attorneys, social workers, advocates, and investigators in order to address not just the immediate legal case, but the host of issues that drive our clients into the justice systems and destabilize their lives.
