## OREGON STATE BAR BYLAW 26

Incorporates sustainability, defined as meeting present needs without comprising the ability of future generations to meet their own needs, into the Oregon State Bar Bylaws.
"Because Bar operations and the practice of law impact the environment and society generally, the Bar will be cognizant of sustainability in its internal operating practices as well as in its service to members."

Designates a sustainability coordinator for the Bar operations

Encourages education and dialogue on how law impacts future generations relative to advancing jurisprudence and improving administration of justice.
